ijCSCL is interested in applicable, high-quality work, from the empirical to the theoretical. This may include the following types of articles:

- An empirical study, a case study or a summary of a set of studies illustrating the usefulness of a particular research methodology, such as multi-level statistical analysis, interpretive conversation analysis, or a combination of complementary methods.
- A literature review of the state-of-the-art of some aspect of CSCL, such as support for sociability and social awareness in CSCL environments or mobile computer support for collaborative learning.
- A conceptual contribution, such as a theoretical analysis of some aspect of computer-mediated collaborative knowledge-building or group meaning-making.
- A proposal concerning an important methodological issue, such as how to integrate quantitative and qualitative analysis within design-based research.
- A description of an innovative CSCL technology or pedagogical approach, with some report of user experiences.
- A discussion of a social issue impacting CSCL as a field, such as cultural barriers to global collaboration.
- An overview of CSCL-related findings at a research lab or research network, along with a description of an agenda for future work.
- Other ... be creative ... propose a new genre.
